





 Safety Risk Management Documentation is nearing completion.

- Visited Helena ADO October 22
- Overall, a positive meeting
- ► FAA supports
 - Phasing Plan
 - Funding Plan
- Helena ADO hopes to get \$15-20M in federal money for SUN in FY 2014

Formulation - FAA Meeting

- Three concerns:
 - 1. Terminal
 - 2. Snow Removal Equipment/ARFF Building
 - 3. North End Taxiway Configuration




FAA: Terminal and SRE/ARFF Concerns

- Cost
- Justification
- ▶ T-O and Mead & Hunt are developing justification documentation

FAA: North End Concerns


- ▶ FAA preference is for perpendicular connectors
- Configured as shown to avoid purchasing land



FAA: North End Concerns

- October 28 email from Steve Engebrecht at Helena ADO
- Three main concerns:
 - Proposed layout does not fully meet the runway parallel taxiway MOS
 - Runway parallel taxiway separation is reduced even more
 - Potential for increased runway incursions
- FAA's preferred solution: "small property acquisition" to eliminate the angled portion of the parallel taxiway


Alternative 1: Property Acquisition



Alternative 1

- Meets FAA's desires
- Requires land acquisition
 - Cost (eligible)
 - Process
 - Environmental
 - Planning not shown on current ALP
 - Land acquisition does not increase capacity of airport in any way


Alternative 2: Reduce Runway Length



Alternative 2

- Meets FAA's desires
- No land acquisition required
- Shortens runway

Alternative 3: Angled Connector



Alternative 3

- No land acquisition required
- No need to shorten runway
- Support by FAA?
 - Non-standard configuration

North End Summary

- No impact on 2014 projects
- Resolution of issue soon is necessary
 - Land acquisition process is lengthy
 - Additional coordination with FAA will be required
- Board feedback/direction desired:
 - Preferences
 - Parameters

Phase 1 Construction Update

- Accomplishments
 - Apron overlay complete
 - Airport Way relocated
 - Fence/gate relocations and modifications
 - Earthwork for taxilane
 - Utility relocations
 - Replacement of Tower propane storage
- ► Total value of construction completed = +\$900,000

Phase 1 Construction Update

- Total value of construction completed = $\pm $900,000$

Phase 2 Construction Scope of Work

- Design, bidding and construction inspection
- Reflects work already completed in Formulation Effort
- Anticipate a Safety Risk Management Panel for construction
- Aggressive schedule

Phase 2 Schedule

- Notice To Proceed, Design December 2013
- Preliminary Design CompleteDecember 31, 2014
- 65% Design Complete January 15, 2014
- 95% Design Complete January 31, 2014
- Final Design/Advertise for BidsFebruary 12, 2014
- Open Bids
- Award
- Start Construction

April 1, 2014

April 28, 2014

Phase 2 Prequalification?

- Prequalification is allowable in Idaho (I.C. 67–2805 3(3)(b))
- Standards must be based on:
 - Demonstrated technical competence
 - Similar experience
 - Prior experience with the political subdivision
 - Available nonfinancial resources (labor and equipment)
 - Overall performance history
- With appeals, process can take up to 100 days

Phase 2 Prequalification

- FAA also allows consideration of "competency"
- In bid probably in conflict with Idaho law
- Owner can refuse to issue documents to a perspective bidder for:
 - Failure of Owner's prequalification process
 - Default under previous contracts with Owner
 - "Unsatisfactory work on previous contracts with the Owner"

- Finalize Scope
- Fee negotiation
- Final approval
- Get to work

Architectural Projects

- Coordinating with FAA on project justification
- Developing Scopes of Work for architectural/engineering services
- Revisions to SRE/ARFF building concepts will take place this month
 - Board input welcome

RFQ - On-call Planning Services

- Last month the Airport Manager updated the Board on the Selection Process
 - Statement of Qualifications were received from Ricondo & Associates, in association with Gallatin Public Affairs and Mead & Hunt, Inc.
- Chairman Fairfax reported on review Committee activities and process
 - The review committee recommended that the Board select Mead & Hunt, Inc.
- The Board directed Staff to postpone the selection of a firm until November
 - This item is on the agenda to facilitate action if the Board deems appropriate

Fly Sun Valley Alliance Report

This item is on the agenda to permit a report if appropriate.

Small Community Air Service Development Program Grant

- Staff has not yet received Grant Offer for the Department of Transportation
- Government shutdown has delayed the process

Site Selection/Master Plan

- During the March 2013 meeting, the Board concluded that following completion of project formulation for Alternative 6 or by October 1, 2013, it would be appropriate to resume formal discussion regarding a site selection process
- Germane planning process
 - 2014–Master Plan
 - 2013–Airport Alternative Technical Analysis
 - 2006-Wood River Region, Airport Site Selection & Feasibility Study
 - 2008–EIS Purpose & Need/Alternatives working paper


Site Selection/Master Plan
