Plan To Meet 2015 Congressional Safety Area Requirement - Formulation

- Goal: Comply with Congressional RSA mandate by end of 2015
 - Construct RSA-related elements of Alternative 6
 - Evaluate Alternative 7 and other improvements in a future planning study
- First Step: Project formulation
 - Refine alternatives
 - Develop an implementation plan

RSA Improvements – Project Formulation Scope of Work

- Goal: Develop a program of projects to make the needed improvements
 - Verify assumptions
 - Make refinements
 - Develop a roadmap for the next three years
- Outline Scope of Work developed after January meeting
 - FAA has reviewed
- Draft document has been completed


Task 3: Project Development

- Verify/refine assumptions




Task 3.1: Topographic Survey

Survey most of the airport




Task 3.2: Geometry

Évaluate proposed airfield geometry, especially in critical areas



Task 3.3: Grading and Drainage

- RSA grading
- Evaluate storm drainage system




Task 3.4: Building Relocations Plan

- Alternative 6 shows relocation/modification of 9 buildings
- Evaluate alternatives/identify issues




Task 3.5: Aircraft Access and Parking

Évaluate impacts to access and parking in GA areas



Task 3.6: Terminal Area Planning

- Develop alternatives for the terminal area
 - Aircraft parking
 - Passenger access



Task 3.7: AWOS Siting Study

Identify a new location for the AWOS



Task 4: ALP Update

- Update Airport Layout Plan to reflect proposed changes.
- No "planning" tasks
 - Forecasts
 - Inventory
 - Etc.
- Update drawings
- Prepare narrative

Task 5: Phasing Plan

- Identify individual projects
 - Operational
 - Construction efficiency
- Estimate timelines for projects
- Coordinate with airport users
- Develop an overall phasing plan that identifies all projects by construction season

Task 6: Capital Improvement Program


- Develop a funding plan for the proposed projects
- Phased by year
- For FAA and FMAA

Task 7: Modifications of Standards

Assist with the MOS process

Revise forms

Technical assistance and coordination




Task 8: Safety Risk Management

- SRM is part of the FAA's Safety Management System.
 - Required for changes to operations at Part 139 airports
 - Looks at the safety risk of the proposed changes
- This task provides assistance with and participation in a panel for these projects
 - Individual panels may be necessary prior to construction of each phase

Task 9: Instrument Approach Feasibility

Analyze the feasibility of Instrument Approach Procedure improvements





Task 10: Environmental Coordination

When the EIS was suspended, the FAA said:

What does the FAA plan to do at this point?

Answer:

- Allow the Friedman Memorial Airport Authority (FMAA) Board time to identify, in discussions with the community, what viable options should be further explored at Friedman Memorial Airport.
- Provide technical guidance to the FMAA Board and community while we and the FMAA board respectively plan our next steps.
- The community has completed the evaluation of options and has set a dual path forward
- FAA agrees with this approach
- Talking Points for Moving Forward

- Significant work must begin within three years of an EIS Final Decision.
- Construction of the airport now looks like a long-term solution.
- Therefore consider requesting termination of the EIS.
 INSTEAD...

- Locate a suitable site.
- Use the data collected during the EIS and other studies.
- Two options:
 - 1. Stand-alone site study or "technical analysis"
 - 2. Locate a site as part of a Master Planning process
- Staff anticipates that a request that the EIS be terminated assumes maximum retention of data developed during the EIS
- A decision to request that the EIS be terminated will have an impact on:
 - 1. 2 AIP Grants
 - 2 contracts funded by AIP

Auto Rental Concession Lease

- Auto Rental Concession Leases with
 Overland West dba Hertz and Avis Rent A-Car are scheduled to expire April 30
- Existing leases were entered into March,
 2006
- Latest extension was completed in March, 2012 and at the same time the Board rejected a request by Enterprise Rent-A-Car to reinstate their on-airport concession agreement

Auto Rental Concession Lease

- The Decision to reject the Enterprise request was based on economic factors
- At the request of the Finance
 Committee, Staff and Legal Counsel met
 with the Finance Committee February
 5th
- The Finance Committee will report and make a recommendation to the Board
