

6 tours per year primarily in the summer months.








ACTUAL POLL TO RUN LAST WEEK OF THIS MONTH


Airport Solutions Existing Site

Runway Safety Area Improvements

- Additional work on terminal:
 - Humidification for TSA IT room
 - Ice melt/gutters on two roof areas
- Only other remaining tasks:
 - As-constructed survey
 - Closeout (AIP '041)

Terminal Aircraft Parking Improvements

- Fee negotiation process for this project is complete
 - Record of Negotiation and request for Concurrence in award forwarded to FAA
 - -Concurrence in award not received yet
- The Board approved the Scope of Work for this project several months ago
- Staff is requesting that the Board approve the fee not to exceed \$184,545 for this project and authorize the Chair to execute the appropriate Work Order once FAA Concurrence in Award has been received
- Staff will insure that appropriate Chair and Legal Counsel reviews take place once FAA Concurrence in Award has been received

Terminal Parking Lot Improvements



Master Plan Update





Master Plan Schedule

- Chapter E, <u>Siting Evaluation for Replacement Airport</u> is again an attachment included in this month's Board material.
- Redline version has not been developed, however the Master Plan Team summarized in the agenda item write-up, changes that will be made based on comments received last month.
- The team anticipates comments from this Board meeting and will update the chapter shortly after receiving those comments
- Chapter F, <u>Preliminary Financial Feasibility Analysis Tables</u>, will be delivered to FMAA by May 10th
 - Once reviewed by Staff, the Chapter F work product will be forwarded to the Board.
 - Chapter F will be placed on the Airport's website
 - Announcement that the chapter is available on the website will be included in an "On the Fly"
- The Master Plan Team will present the Chapter F deliverable during the June 2016 Board meeting.

Noise Modeling/Monitoring

- Two months ago, the Board directed Staff to gather information regarding Noise Modeling and or Monitoring
- Last month, Mr. Peter Kirsch answered Board questions related to noise modeling/monitoring from a legal point of view
- The next step, with Board permission, might be to have a consultant that actually manages noise modeling and or monitoring programs to discuss process and product with the Board
- Staff has scheduled a representative from Landrum and Brown during June 16 Board meeting

Air Quality Modeling/Monitoring

- Two months ago, the Board directed Staff to gather information regarding Air Quality Modeling and or Monitoring
- Last month, Mr. Peter Kirsch answered Board questions related to air quality modeling/monitoring from a legal point of view
- The next step, with Board permission, might be to have a consultant that actually manages Air Quality Modeling and or Monitoring programs to discuss process and product with the Board
- Staff has scheduled a representative from Landrum and Brown during June 16 Board meeting

Letters of Concern

- ▶ De-ice Material Use at FMA
- Opposite Direction Traffic

De-Ice Material Use

- Staff and FAA received letters concerned about disposal of storm water containing deicing materials
- Staff and consultants have researched this issue thoroughly

De-Icing?

- De-icing = melting/removal of snow, ice or frost
- Anti-icing = preventing the formation of ice on a surface

Pavement

- Applied before or after a storm starts
- Purposes:
 - Aid snow and ice removal
 - Improve surface friction



Pavement

- ITD typically uses magnesium chloride on roads
- Airport uses Cryotech E36
 - Potassium acetate solution
 - Safe for aircraft
- Environmentally safe
 - Little hazard to humans, except in large quantities
 - "Relatively harmless" US Fish & Wildlife
 - Biodegrades quickly, even at low temperatures

Pavement

- Airport uses a small amount of product
 - 2,000 gallons in FY 2015
 - Approximately 350 acres of pavement de-iced
 - 0.175 gal/acre/year
- Disposed of/treated in shoulders and swales

Aircraft

Critical to safe flying in cold weather

Airlines and Atlantic Aviation use propylene

glycol



Propylene Glycol

- Variety of uses
 - Food production
 - Cosmetics
 - Medicine
 - Anti-freeze
- "Generally Recognized As Safe" FDA







Propylene Glycol

- Used on airports throughout the country
 - Safe for aircraft
 - Non-toxic



Propylene Glycol

- Environmental Impact
 - Biodegradable
 - High "biological oxygen demand"
 - Hazardous to aquatic species
 - Protect surface waters from PG
- Treatment
 - Swales/wetlands
 - Sanitary sewer



FMA Drainage System


- East side
 - Flows "overland" to swale at southeast corner
 - Infiltrates
- West side
 - Storm drainage system
 - Treated and disposed in swale at southwest corner





FMA Deicing Fluid Management

- All aircraft deicing takes place on North Ramp
- Fluid collected in trench drains, stored in underground tank
- Discharged to storm drain



Testing

- Four samples:
 - Two from tank
 - One from drywell
 - One soil









Testing – Results

Sample	PG Detected	Concentration
Tank - Pre-Mix	144,000 mg/L	14.4%
Tank - Post-Mix	174,000 mg/L	17.4%
Drywell	94.3 mg/L	0.0094%
Soil	None detected	_

Conclusions

- System is working as designed
 - Tank is retaining propylene glycol
 - Storm drain/swale is treating propylene glycol before entering drywell

Recommendations

- Pump tank and recycle/dispose of deicing solution
- Institute a program to pump the tank regularly during deicing season
- Alternatively, connect tank to sanitary sewer with a system to pump the de-icing material

Discussion of Airport Manager Succession and Next Steps

- Position announcement and description have been developed and posted on the Airport's website and distributed on a regional level to airport managers, the NWAAAE and airport contacts.
- ▶ Short term outreach deadline is May 13, 2016
- Searching for a candidate that will meet specific qualifications associated with Friedman.

Discussion of Airport Manager Succession and Next Steps, cont.

If short term outreach does not produce a pool of qualified candidates, the search committee is prepared to contract with a national search firm.

Action:

Staff is asking for Board discussion and direction on how to proceed with the selection process once applications are received.



AIP '042 Grant Application


- Design-only services for the Terminal Apron Improvements Project
- ▶ Total amount requested: \$200,000
- Grant offer expected in June
 - Separate actions by City and County will be required to accept the grant offer

AIP '042 Grant Application

- Board Action requested:
 - Approve the application and authorize Staff to sign and submit the application. In addition, authorize Staff and Legal Counsel to develop and process the appropriate resolutions from City and County to accept the grant, at the appropriate time.

Small Community Air Service Program

- On March 28, 2016, the Department of Transportation (DOT) issued an order requesting proposal to participate in the Small Community Air Service Development Program (SCASDP)
 - With assistance from Mead & Hunt and Fly Sun Valley Alliance, Staff submitted a grant.
- Application is a public/private partnership between FMAA, Fly Sun Valley Alliance, Sun Valley Company and Sun Valley Marketing Alliance
 - The grant proposal requests \$500,000 in grant funds to assist with adding a non-stop service by Alaska Airlines to Portland, Oregon
 - As you know, history indicates that this private-public partnership has succeeded and can succeed again with grant objectives
- If the grant is awarded to FMAA, the Board can anticipate the actual grant offer on a future agenda, for approval and processing
