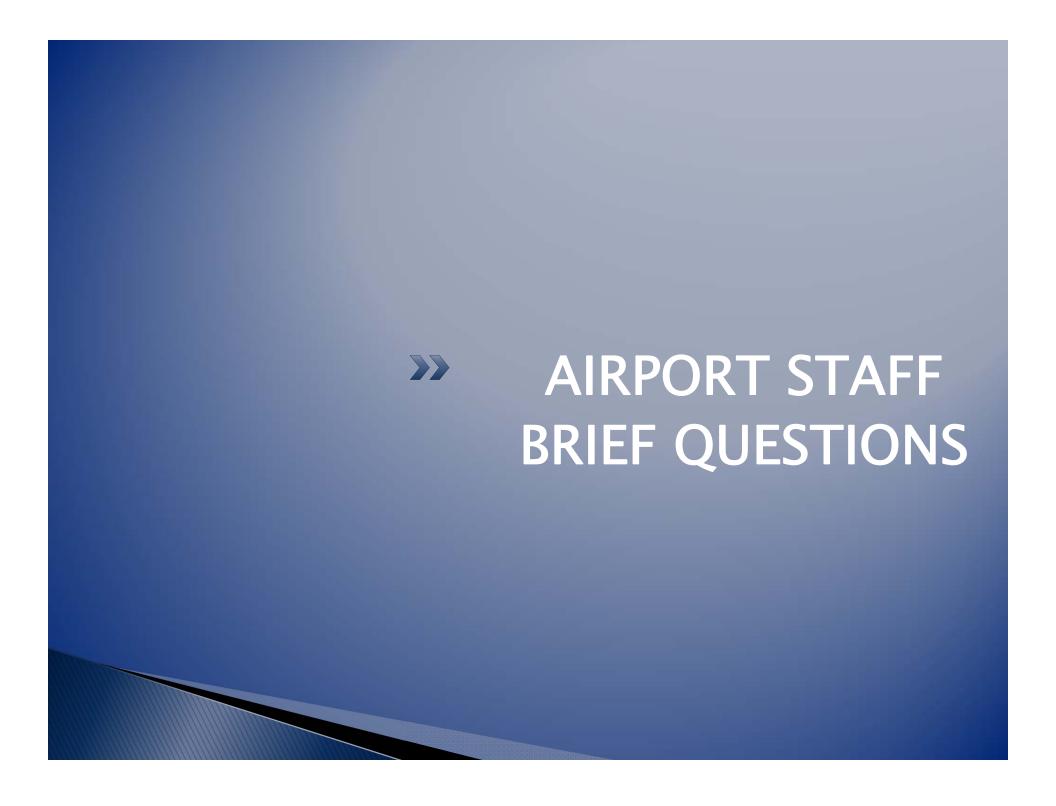


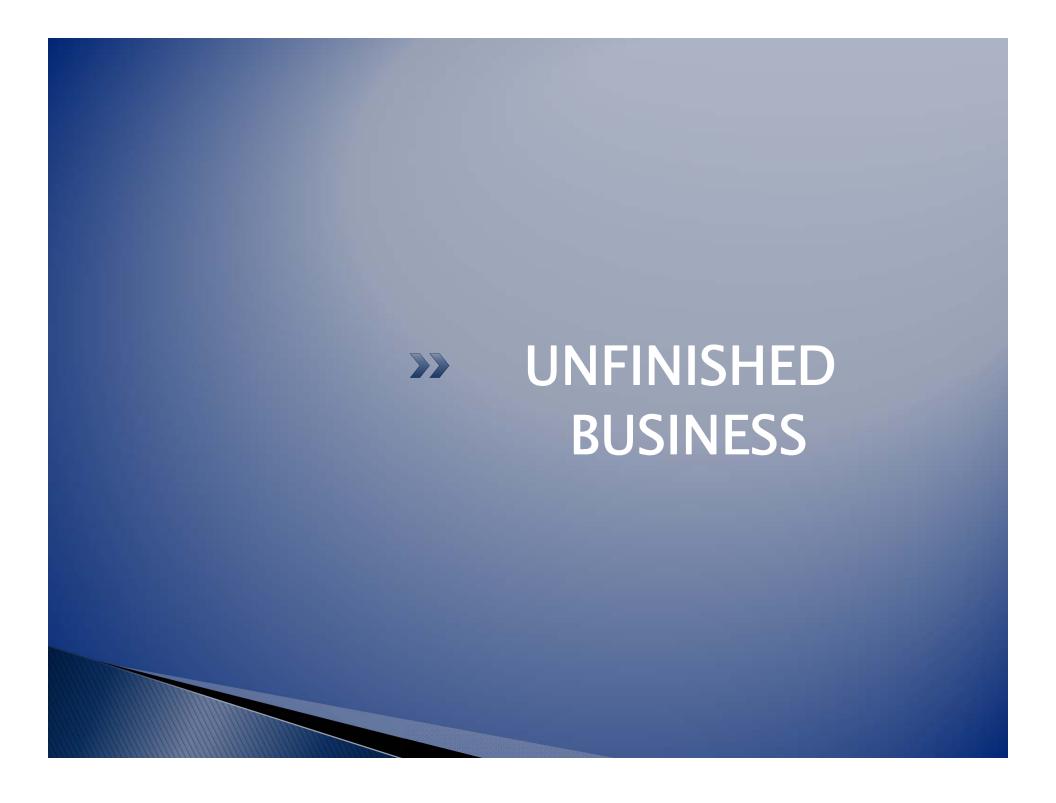

Airport Solutions Existing Site

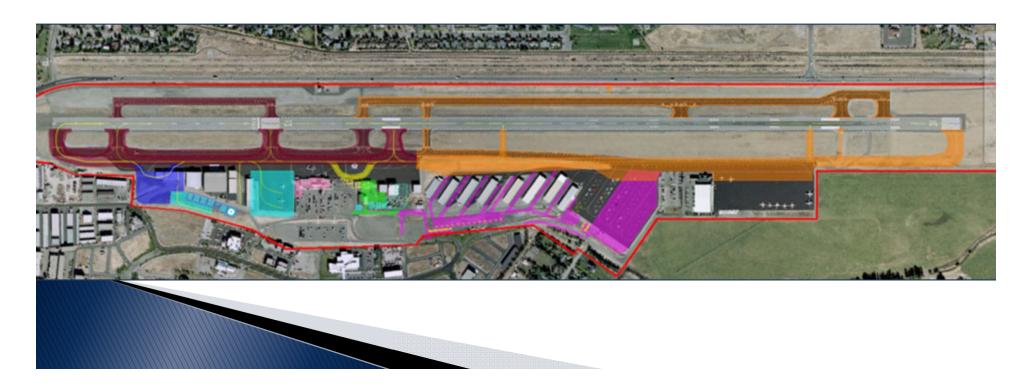

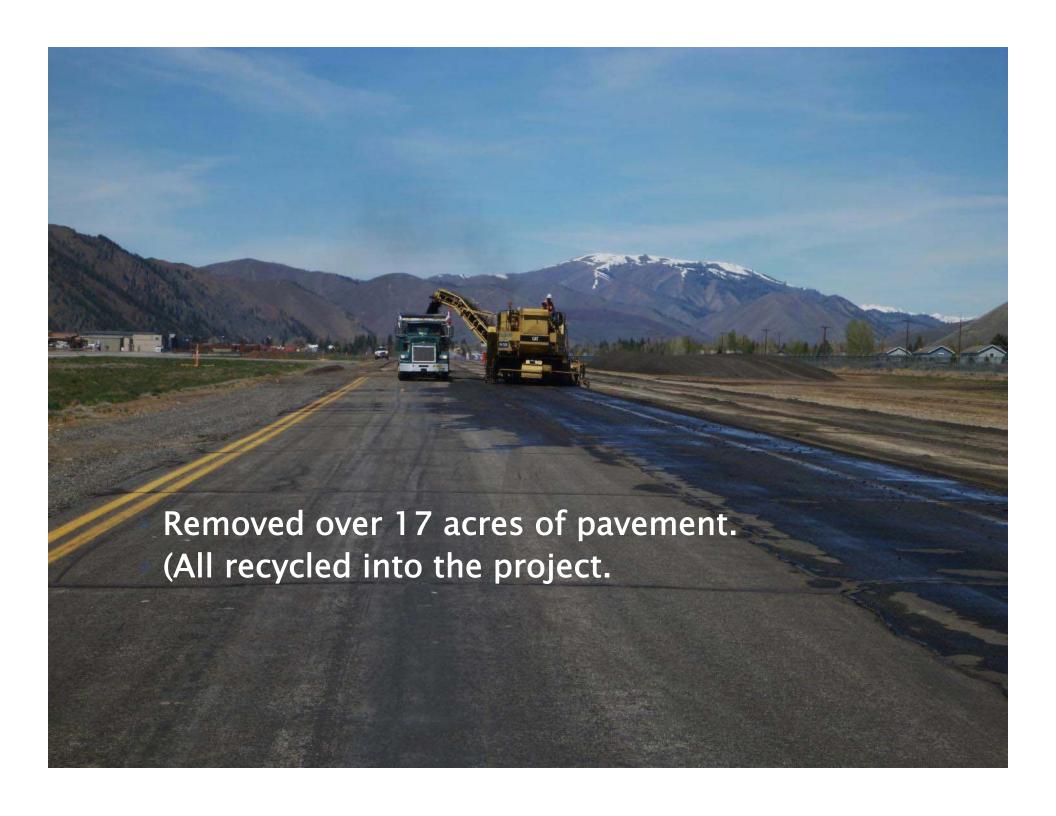

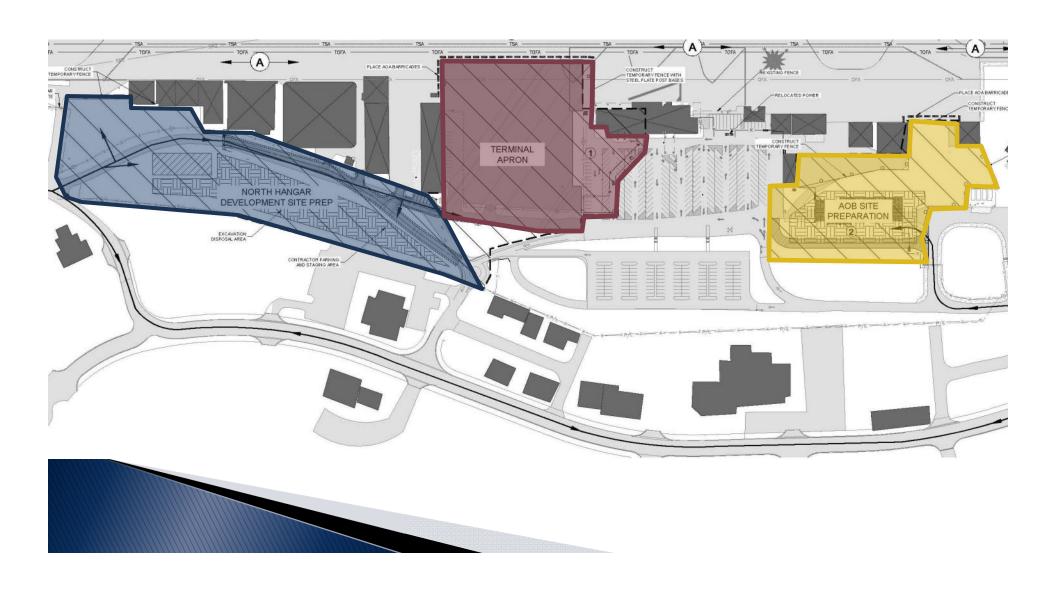

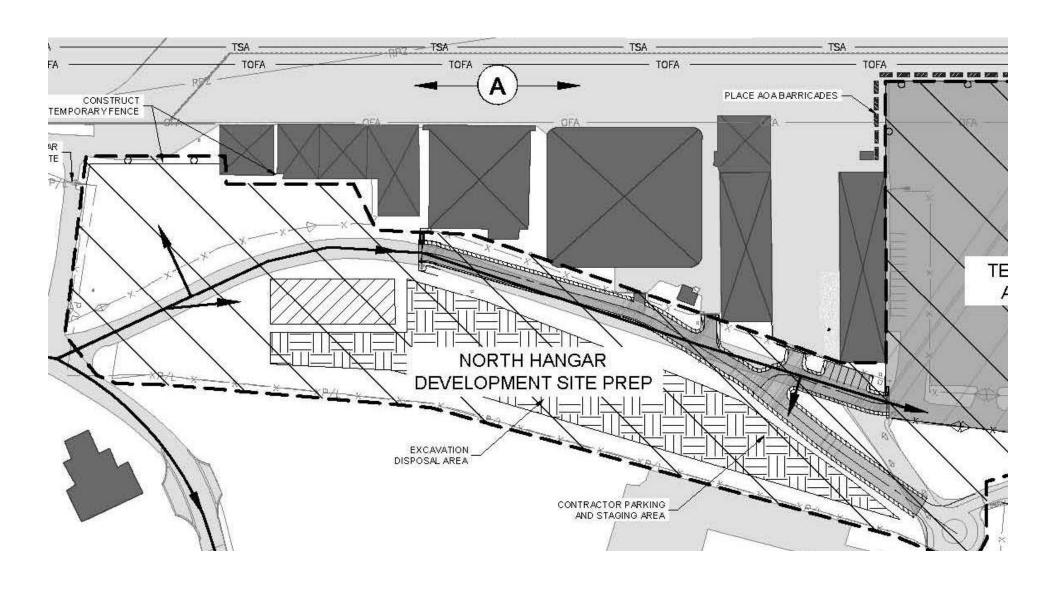

- Construction Start: Late August

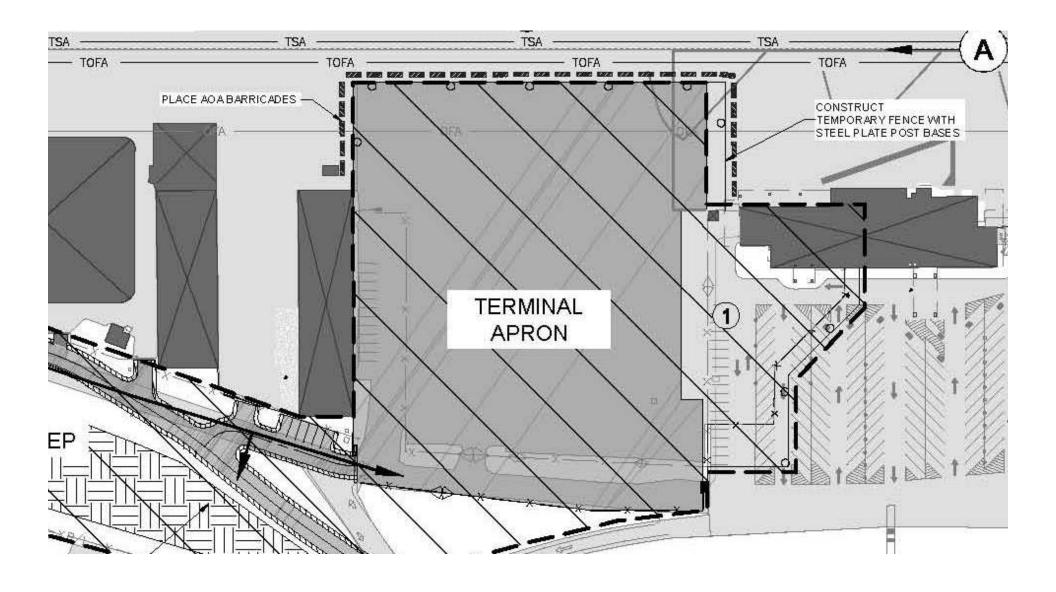

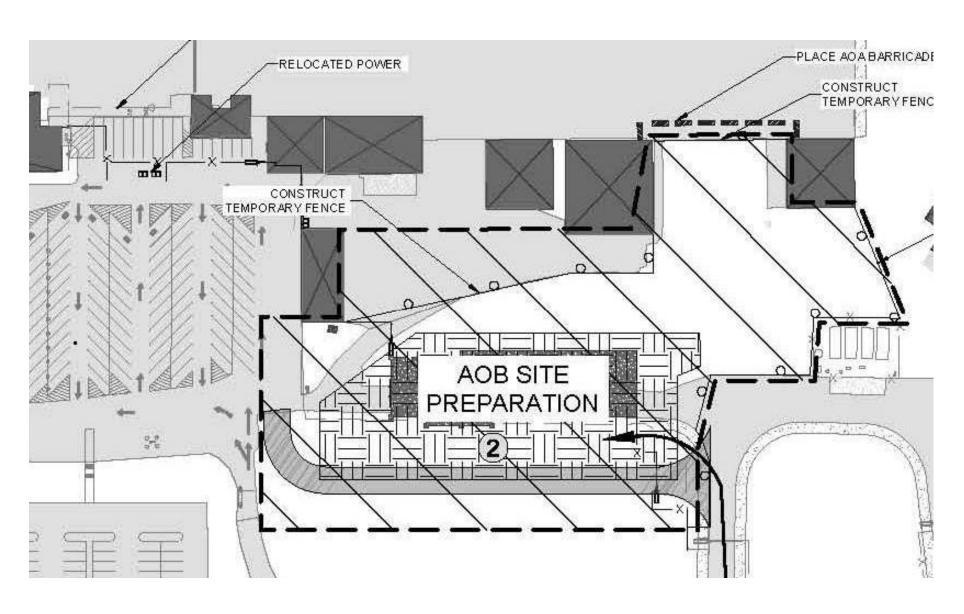

Facility Acquisitions

- Appraisals and review appraisals were received and are in agreement
- Hangars
 - Offer letters delivered to all hangar owner
 - Five have responded favorably
 - Closing on all five hangars successfully took place on schedule June 30th
 - Two plan to reconstruct, three do not
- Discussions with USFS are ongoing

Master Plan Update

- The Board approved a Master Plan Scope of Work during the April Board meeting
- Staff has been working thru an Independent Fee Estimate (IFE) and Fee Negotiation Process since April
 - Initial Fee Estimate \$644,837
 - Fee Estimate after discussion \$623,722
 - Independent Fee Estimate \$580,680
 - Negotiated Fee Estimate \$611,726
 - Negotiated FEE is a 5% reduction from initial fee
 - Negotiated Fee estimate is 5% higher than IFE (10% considered reasonable)
- Approve Mead & Hunt proposed fee not-toexceed \$611,726



FY 15'Draft Rates & Charges

- Staff has integrated Board and Committee comments and concerns to arrive at a sound and responsible conclusion.
 - Runway Safety Area Improvement Project has and will continue to draw significant capital from FMA Operational Reserves.
 - Not all expenditures are covered or recoverable thru AIP or PFC.
 - They are recoverable thru Rates & Charges adjustment.
 - Recovery strategy utilizes a 20 year reimbursement schedule, modeled after a depreciation schedule.
 - This strategy results in approximately \$150,000 in FY '15 with automatic CPI increases annually for the following 19 years.

FY 15'Draft Rates & Charges

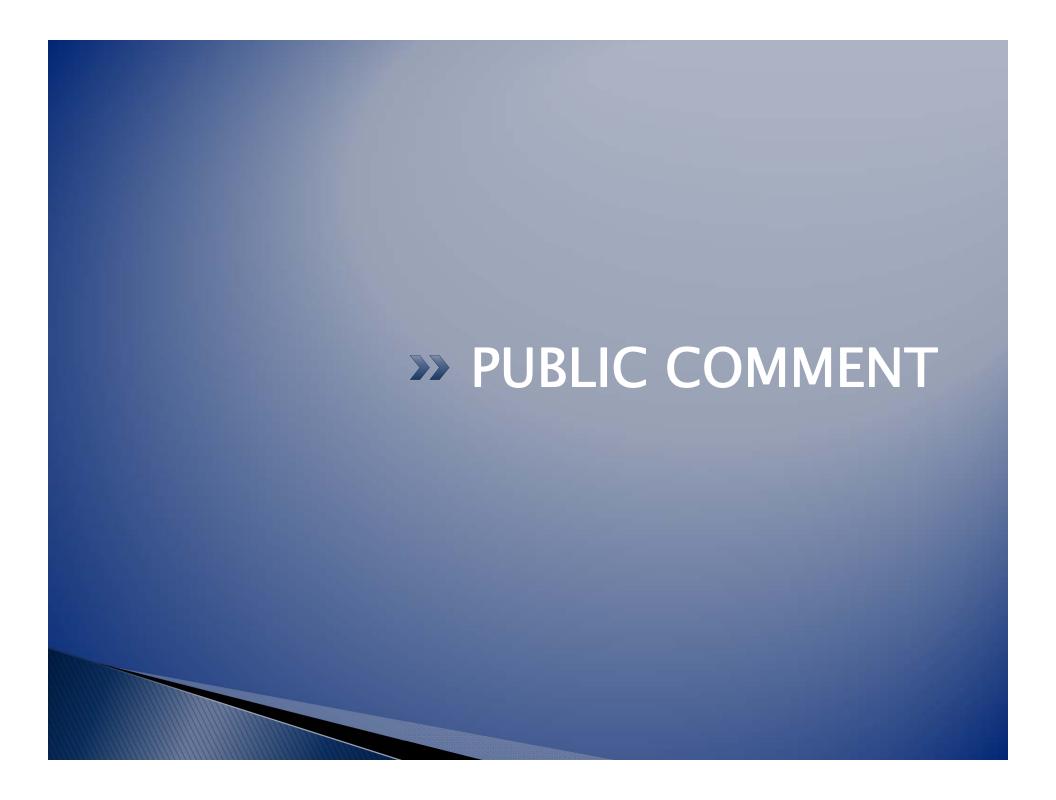
- Rates & Charges adjustments focused on Landing Fees, Transient Aircraft Parking Fees, and Passenger Terminal Parking Fees.
- Rates & Charges adjustments are related to activities that initiated the expenditures
- Survey of similar Airport rates and charges indicates that even after implementing suggested Rates & Charges adjustments FMA remains average or below average compared to competitive set airports.
- When appropriate direct Staff to establish a Public Hearing for the proposed FY' 15 Rates and Charges.

FY 15'Draft Budget

- Staff and Committee have reviewed all comments and refined the Draft FY'15 Budget for Board consideration.
- ▶ The FY'15 Budget:
 - Provides the Board the ability to operate FMA and meet all of the coming year's needs.
 - Meets FMA needs regarding Safety Area Implementation projects.
 - Includes a salary adjustment for the Airport Manager.
 - Proposes 2.0% CPI adjustments in employee compensation (2% is based on the Consumer Price Indexes Pacific Cities and U.S. City Average).
 - Includes the ability to adjust compensation 3% maximum cap for salary adjustments predicated on merit – based performance over the course of the year.

FY 15'Draft Budget (Continued)

- Continues to support the Board's goal to Master Plan, sooner, rather than later.
- Supports continued progress toward improved reliability.
- Is designed so that all revenue generated by the Airport and any local taxes on aviation fuel are expended by the Authority for the capital or operational expenses of the Airport.
- Begins the process of restoring FMA Operational Reserves to pre-Runway Safety Area Implementation Project capacity.
- When appropriate direct Staff to establish a Public Hearing for the Proposed FY' Budget
