



#### Runway Safety Area Improvements

- Work is completed on:
  - Humidification for TSA IT room
  - Ice melt/gutters on two roof areas
- Working on one issue with the metal detector
- Only other remaining tasks:
  - As-constructed survey
  - Closeout (AIP '041)

### RSA Improvements: Grant Amendment

- Primarily due to terminal change orders and the "Public Lounge"
- ▶ Total amount needed = \$49,393.20
- Will request \$50,000
- Letter request will be routed through City and County


### Scope of Work Tasks

- Develop Capital Improvement Program
  - Existing Airport Scenario
  - Replacement Airport Scenario
- Identify Funding Sources
- Provide Projections of Operating Revenues and Expenses
- Develop Cash Flow Analysis

### Assumptions: Funding Sources

- Master Plan Activity Levels (3.48% enplanement & 1.4% operations growth)
  - 2024 Enplanements: 93,496
  - 2034 Enplanements: 131,630
- Funding Sources
  - FAA Airport Improvement Program (AIP)
  - Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) Revenues
  - Local Annual Airport Authority Net Operating Revenues
  - Customer Facility Charge (CFC) Revenues
  - Private/3<sup>rd</sup> Party

## Existing Airport Scenario CIP (2017–2034)



\$47.8 Million Investment


## Existing Airport Scenario CIP: Assumptions

- \$31.8 million FAA
  - \$18.5 million entitlement \$850,000 AIP Entitlement carryover (FY2017 projects)
  - \$13.3 million discretionary
- \$0.85 million PFC Revenue
  - Current applications commit collection/use through FY2023
  - Future applications
    - Fund FY2024 2034 eligible Projects
    - Reimburses Airport Authority for FY2017–2023 Projects
- \$15.2 million Local (Airport Authority Net Operating Revenue)
  - Beginning Operating Reserve Balance \$2.0 million
  - Parking Projects: 100% Airport Authority Funded \$12.8 million of Total \$15.2 million Local Share
    - 2017 Alternative 2 (107 spaces) \$670,000
    - 2022 Alternative 3 Phase 1 (286 spaces) \$761,000
    - 2022 Acquire Land Auto Parking \$900,000
    - 2030 Alternative 3 Phase 2 (125 spaces) \$440,000
    - 2034 Construct Parking Structure (net increase 150 spaces) \$10.0 million

### Existing Airport Scenario: Funding and Cash Flow

- ▶ \$7.5 million projected Airport Authority Ending Balance as of FY2033; prior to Parking Structure
- Airline Cost Per Enplaned Passenger (CPE)
  - 2019 \$4.00
  - 2034 \$4.22
- Conclusions
  - Plan can be funded without incurring debt with exception of Parking Structure (2034)
  - Airline CPE is reasonable and within industry norm

## Replacement Airport Scenario CIP (2017–2034)



#### Replacement Airport Scenario CIP

- ▶ 20 Year Investment of \$337.9 million
- \$850,000 AIP Entitlement carryover FY2017 projects
- Existing Airport Projects (FY2017–2021) \$15.9 million total

Expand Commercial Apron Terminal ATO/Ticketing

Construct ATCT ARFF Equipment

Rehabilitate Runway Snow Removal Equipment

- Replacement Airport: \$322.0 million
  - Work Commences FY2022
  - Date of Building Occupancy FY2034

## Replacement Airport Scenario: Funding and Cash Flow Analysis

- Replacement Airport Investment (Excludes Existing Airport)
  - \$134.0 million Authority
  - \$100.0 million FAA
    - \$13.0 million entitlement
    - \$87.0 million discretionary
  - \$80.0 million Private/3<sup>rd</sup> Party
  - \$4.8 million PFC
  - \$3.0 million CFC
- · FAA Funding dedicated to Airfield, Control Tower, and Navaids

## Replacement Airport Scenario: Funding and Cash Flow Analysis

- ▶ Beginning Operating Reserve Balance \$2.0 million
- \$127.6 million funding shortfall as of FY2034
- Options for Funding Shortfall
  - Investment in Project by Local Airport Stakeholders
  - FMA Airport Revenue Bonds
  - Blaine County General Obligation Bonds
  - Tax increment financing

Annual Debt Service = \$13.0 million (estimated)

#### Discussion - Replacement Airport Scenario CIP

- \$127.6 million Local Funding Shortfall
- Shortfall Could Increase if FAA Funding is not Attained
  - Historical FAA Funding for Small/Non-hub Replacement Airports
    - St. George Airport \$90.0 million (2008–2015)
    - Northwest Arkansas Regional Airport \$29.5 million (1998–2002)
    - Sloulin Field International Airport \$120.0 million (Pending Decision)
  - FAA Letter of Intent (LOI) Trends
    - 10 LOIs are currently active; Total Value of \$1.0 billion
    - All 10 are for medium to large hub airports
    - FY2016 payments total \$170.0 million
    - FAA has reduced issuance of LOIs in Recent Years
    - Decrease in Available Discretionary Funds due to Protection of Entitlement Carryover

### Discussion – Existing Airport Scenario CIP

- Implement with Positive Cash Flow and Borrow only for Parking Garage (2034)
- Requires Future PFC Applications
- Airport Authority Operating Reserves Reimbursed through PFC Revenue

#### **Opposite Direction Traffic**

- As a means to understand the nature of complaints filed with FAA regarding Opposite Direction Traffic, the Airport Manager submitted a FOIA request
- A summary was included in this Board material for Board and Public review
- ▶ The complaint contained 7 allegations
- Four allegations were not substantiated
- Two allegations were substantiated I both substantiated cases appropriate action was taken

## Opposite Direction Traffic Continued

- One allegation regarding hearing aircraft flying low over the community was handled in an informative manner
- Appropriate reporting procedures were delineated

# Discussion of Airport Manager Succession and Next Steps

- The Board conducted interviews on July 10, 2016
- This item is on the agenda to facilitate discussion of actions the board feel may be appropriate



#### FY '17 Draft Budget

- Airport Staff and the Board's Finance Committee have been working on a Draft Budget for weeks
- ▶ The Draft FY'17 Budget:
  - Provides the board the ability to operate FMA and meets all of the coming year's needs
  - Provides flexibility to the new Airport Manager
  - Acknowledges new airfield layout

#### FY '17 Draft Budget

- Acknowledges larger and busier air passenger terminal complex
- Recognizes additional expenses related to new landscaping
- Acknowledges additional snow removal requirements based on:
  - Increased airline schedules
  - New airfield configuration

#### FY '17 Draft Budget

- Facilitates the continued Master Planning process
- Provides Chair and new Airport Manager flexibility to compensate employees based on merit. Does not propose any CPI pay adjustment
- Continues the process of replenishing Operational Reserves
- Does not consider adjustments proposed to the Rates and Charges Schedule. If approved, revenues can be adjusted accordingly

#### FY '17 Draft Rates and Charges


- Rates & Charges, when integrated into the FY'17 Budget will provide the Board the ability to operate FMA and meet all of the coming years's needs
- Staff is recommending that the Board adjust the following areas
  - Daily Auto Parking fees
  - Advertising
  - Landing Fees
  - Fuel Flowage

#### FY '17 Draft Rates and Charges

- Staff Recommendation is supported by an independent review of the FY' 17 Draft Budget and rates of competitive set airports
- If the Board chooses to move the Draft Rates and Charges to Public Hearing next month Staff will Estimate increased cash flow
- The outcome of adjustments will be continued replenishment of operational reserves and providing the Board the ability to ensure that air services survive and thrive in the future
