SUN scoops up prestigious Balchen/Post Award for excellence in snow and ice control

Hailey, Idaho – Friedman Memorial Airport, nestled in the breathtaking Sawtooth Mountains, has been honored with the esteemed <u>Balchen/Post Award</u> for excellence in snow and ice control. The announcement follows an award ceremony held last Monday at the International Aviation Snow Symposium in Buffalo, NY.

Presented by the Northeast Chapter of the American Association of Airport Executives (AAAE), the Balchen/Post Award is internationally recognized and seeks to promote better snow and ice control and to recognize those individuals responsible for outstanding performance. Friedman Memorial Airport emerged victorious in the Small Commercial Airport Category (those with less than 100,000 annual operations), surpassing numerous contenders with its exceptional dedication to swift, efficient, and safe snow and ice removal while maintaining uninterrupted airport operations.

Airports vying for this recognition undergo rigorous evaluation based on several criteria, including the depth of preparedness, effectiveness of snow and ice control programs across critical areas such as runways, taxiways, and ramps, as well as the timeliness and accuracy of communications with stakeholders during snow and ice events.

For nearly four years, the SUN Airport Operations team has not turned away a single flight operation due to poor runway conditions related to snow accumulation—a feat that is nearly unheard of in the aviation community.

"This award symbolizes the commitment, dedication, and tireless efforts of our exceptional Airport Operations team and our seasonal staff," remarked Tim Burke, Deputy Director. "Their round-the-clock dedication, including early mornings and late nights, ensures that SUN remains one of the safest, reliable, and most effectively

managed commercial service airports in the nation. This achievement is a testament to their professionalism and our unwavering commitment to excellence."
